

It is with great pleasure that I invite you to join me this October on a bridge-themed adventure to the Scottish Highlands. The main events are Café Bridge Days in Dunkeld and Plockton, which attract players from all over the Scottish mainland and the Hebrides.

Take the train non-stop first class to Scotland, and experience the charm of Dunkeld and history of Inverness. Travel through breathtaking, unspoilt landscapes of the Highlands, and discover the coastal villages of Plockton and Kyle in the Gaelic heartland of the far North.

We set off from London on Monday lunchtime, taking in Dunkeld Café Bridge Day on Tuesday, and a free morning in Inverness, an evening event in Plockton, and finish on Thursday with Plockton Café Bridge. Non-bridge playing friends, spouses and partners are warmly welcomed. Return travel is **not** included by default, as some have asked to stay on and make their own way back to London. I am offering a booking service for the Caledonian Sleeper back to Euston, return on a day train, or extra nights in Plockton, so please take advantage of this if it suits you.

About Dunkeld

Dunkeld and its sister village Birnam sit astride the River Tay just downstream of the Tay Forest Park, connected by Thomas Telford's iconic seven-arch bridge. Just south of Birnam you can visit the wood which came to life to bring about King Macbeth's demise.

Our hosts will be the keen Blairgowrie 'Spoons gang, and we will meet players from Dunkeld, Blairgowrie, Pitlochry, Perth and further afield.

About Inverness

Arriving by evening into the capital of the Highlands evokes an impression of remoteness and separation from what has gone before. The bustling pubs attract folk musicians from across the Highlands and even Orkney.

The morning sun reveals the bold skyline of a city, the UK's most northerly, which has been key in almost every period of Scottish history. This year our timings will permit a visit to the nearby Scottish National Trust Culloden battlefield site for those interested.

Also don't miss the castle, museum, textile shops and the bouncy bridge.

About Plockton

Plockton, known as "The Jewel of the Highlands", is a picturesque village that sits on a sheltered bay with stunning views overlooking Loch Carron. It is a popular destination for walking, cycling, arts and crafts, water-sports, and Gaelic music and culture. The Isle of Skye, with its unique natural habitat, is easily accessible by road bridge.

Our hosts will be the friendly and active bridge club in the neighbouring village of Kyle of Lochalsh, whose club nights attract players from Inverness-shire, Ross-shire and Skye.

Accommodation - The Royal Dunkeld Hotel

The Royal Dunkeld Hotel dates from 1810, just after the completion of the Telford Bridge. It is situated on Atholl Road around the corner from the historic 'little houses' and specialist shops and the famous cathedral. It has a friendly bar with occasional live music, and a spacious ballroom where we will meet for the Café Bridge.
