

It is with great pleasure that I invite you to join me this October on a bridge-themed adventure to the Scottish Highlands. The main events are Café Bridge Days in Dunkeld and Plockton, which attract players from all over the Scottish mainland and the Hebrides.

Take the train non-stop first class to Scotland, and experience the charm of Dunkeld and history of Inverness. Travel through breathtaking, unspoilt Highland landscapes, and discover the coastal villages of Plockton and Kyle in the Gaelic heartland of the far North.

We set off from London King's Cross on Monday at noon, arriving in Dunkeld to relax to live Scottish music. Walking shoes on for Dunkeld Café Bridge Day on Tuesday, then overnight in Inverness. Wednesday is free - just get to Plockton in time for the welcome buffet and bridge in the Village Hall. We finish on Thursday with Café Bridge along Plockton Bay.

Non-bridge playing friends, spouses and partners are warmly welcomed.

Return travel is **not** included by default, as some have asked to stay on and make their own way back to London. I am able to book tickets to order for the Caledonian Sleeper back to Euston, a day train, or extra nights in Plockton, Kyle of Lochalsh or Inverness.

About Dunkeld

Dunkeld and its sister village Birnam sit astride the River Tay just downstream of the Tay Forest Park, connected by Thomas Telford's iconic seven-arch bridge. Just south of Birnam you can visit the wood which comes to life in Act V of Shakespeare's Macbeth.

Our hosts will be the keen Blairgowrie 'Spoons bridge gang, and we will meet players from Dunkeld, Blairgowrie, Pitlochry, Perth and further afield.

About Inverness

Evening arrival into the capital of the Highlands brings a sense of the sheer remoteness of this distant part of the country and its traditions and culture. Folk musicians visit the pubs from as far away as Orkney.

The morning sun reveals the bold skyline of Britain's most northerly city, which has been key in almost every period of Scottish history. This year our timings will allow those interested to arrange a visit to the nearby Scottish National Trust Culloden Battlefield and Visitor Centre.

Also don't miss the castle, museum, textile shops and the bouncy bridge.

About Plockton

Plockton, known as "The Jewel of the Highlands", is a picturesque village that sits on a sheltered bay with stunning views overlooking Loch Carron. It is a popular destination for walking, cycling, arts and crafts, water-sports, and Gaelic music and culture. The Isle of Skye, with its unique natural habitat, is easily accessible by road bridge.

Our hosts will be the friendly and active bridge club in the neighbouring village of Kyle of Lochalsh, whose club nights attract players from Inverness-shire, Ross-shire and Skye.

Accommodation - The Royal Dunkeld Hotel

The Royal Dunkeld Hotel dates from 1810, just after the completion of the Telford Bridge. It stands on Dunkeld's high street Atholl Road around the corner from the historic 'little houses' and specialist shops and the famous cathedral. It has a friendly bar with occasional live music, and a spacious ballroom where we will meet for the Café Bridge.

Accommodation - The Royal Highland Hotel of Inverness

The Royal Highland is an iconic station hotel dating from 1856 with a grand staircase that inspired many interiors including those of The Titanic. Thoroughly modernized, it remains in independent hands and is conveniently located for shopping and onward travel.
